



SUPPORTING EVIDENCE CHECKLIST FOR DAPA DEFERRED ACTION FOR PARENTS OF U.S. CITIZENS AND PERMANENT RESIDENTS

Identity Documents (one item on this list)

- ☐ Passport
- ☐ Any national identity document from your country of origin with photo
- ☐ Any U.S.-government immigration or other document with your name and photo
- ☐ Birth certificate PLUS photo ID
- ☐ Any school-issued form of ID with photo; or
- ☐ Any other relevant document

Documents showing you have a child who is a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident (one or more items from each section)

- ☐ Child's U.S. passport
- ☐ Child's naturalization certificate
- ☐ Child's green card
- ☐ Any other relevant document

AND

- ☐ Birth certificate showing your name and the name of your child
- ☐ Results of DNA test
- ☐ Any other relevant document

Documents showing you were out of status on November 20, 2014

(don't worry about this if you never had papers or an immigration court case)

- ☐ I-94/I-95/I-94W Arrival/Departure Record showing date authorized stay expired
- ☐ Final removal order with a date that is earlier than 11/20/2014
- ☐ Any other relevant document

Documents to demonstrate you are not an enforcement priority:

Documents showing that you were present in the U.S. on November 20, 2014 and that you have lived in the U.S. continuously since January 1, 2010

(as much as possible and at least one document per year)

- ☐ Rent receipts, utility bills (gas, electric, phone, etc.), receipts or letters from companies showing the dates you received service
- ☐ Employment records¹ (e.g., pay stubs, W-2 Forms, certification of the filing of federal or state income tax returns, etc.)
- ☐ School records (transcripts, report cards, etc.) from the schools that you have attended in the U.S., showing name of school & when you attended
- ☐ Hospital or medical records
- ☐ Records from a church or mosque or other place of worship in the U.S., confirming that you were involved in a religious ceremony
- ☐ Money order receipts for money sent in or out of the country; passport entries; birth certificates of children born in the United States; dated bank transactions; correspondence between you and another person or organization in the U.S.; automobile titles; vehicle registration; deeds; mortgages; rental agreements; etc.
- ☐ Affidavits to fill gaps²
- ☐ Any other relevant document

¹ Double check that your employment records do not include a false social security number. If they do, try to find other evidence to show that you were here.
